WHO SHOULD APPLY

This summer school is ideal for students eager to expand their knowledge and develop critical perspectives on contemporary democratic challenges and the evolving role of law in addressing them. To enrol in the Summer School, students are expected to have completed at least 60 ECTS (i.e. one full year of studies) in law, political science, sociology, economics, or related disciplines prior to the start of the Summer School programme.

LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS

The Summer School will be taught in English. Students are expected to have sufficient knowledge of English at B2 level minimum, while C1 level is strongly recommended.

EXAMINATION

Regular attendance of at least 85% of all obligatory Summer School activities and a passing grade on the final exam are required for successful completion of the programme. The final exam will take place in a written form and will be graded on a Pass/Fail scale. Upon completion of the programme you will receive the Certificate. Workload of the Summer School programme is equivalent to 4 ECTS.
