

The master's programme in "Human Rights, International Criminal Law, and Transitional Justice" is a one-year program (60 ECTS) designed to educate 25 professionals in the field of Human Rights, International Criminal Law and Transitional Justice.

The program's comprehensive curriculum encompasses current and relevant topics at the local, regional, and international levels. The program will admit a maximum of five (5) international students.

Eligible candidates for application are students who have successfully completed their undergraduate studies in law, political sciences, public administration, economics, psychology, and humanities.

The language of instruction for the program is English, and it welcomes a diverse group of 25 students from both local and international backgrounds.

# The program duration is one academic year (60 ECTS) and will feature:

Expertise from International Co-Professors: Each course will be conducted by an esteemed international Co-Professor, hailing from prestigious universities, including institutions from Europe and the United States. These experts will not only deliver lectures but also provide valuable mentorship.

**Tuition Fee Waiver:** The program offers a tuition-free education to all enrolled students, regardless of their nationality or origin.

Accommodation for International Students: International students coming from outside Kosovo will be provided accommodation at the University of Prishtina's Student Center at no additional cost.

Scholarships for International Students: A total of five (5) full scholarships, each covering the study period (lectures period) with a monthly stipend of 500 euros, will be available to outstanding international students.

Study Visits: The program includes opportunities for study visits for international students. Potential countries/institutions: to Strasbourg in ECtHR (France); to The Hague, ICTY, ICC (The Netherlands); to the Nuremberg (Germany) or to the countries in the region.

**Research Internships:** All students will have the opportunity to engage in research internships at prominent institutions and centers in Kosovo and the surrounding region.

Apart from funding provided by the Faculty of Law at the University of Prishtina, the program is also supported by esteemed partners, including the Federal Government of Switzerland, the United Nations Office of the High Commissioner for Human Rights.
